knowledge and skills we will be covering this half term.

Enquiry Question	<p>Do you have a favourite story? Project- Once upon a time (Sparkle and shine)</p>
Significant People	<p>Jean Loo – Director of Superhero Me</p> 
Class Texts	<p>The Gingerbread Man, The 3 Billy Goat's Gruff, Goldilocks and the 3 bears</p> 
Literacy	<p>The children will be learning Phase 1 phonics– Rhyming words and Action songs.</p> <p>Reading favourite stories. Can we talk about the pictures? What will happen next?</p> <p>Filling in missing words from a rhyme (Run, run as fast as you can, you can't catch me, I'm the gingerbread ...)</p> <p>Learning the names of different parts of a book (Front cover, back cover, pages)</p>

Maths	The children will be learning about size and using new vocabulary related to size (Big, medium, small). The children will take part in counting out natural objects from 1 to 5. The children will sort objects by colour, size and shape (Spoons, bowls and chairs).
Communication and Language	<p>Clapping out rhymes and joining in with actions.</p> <p>Talking about different experiences and celebrations.</p> <p>Using past and present tenses (I played with my toy)</p> <p>Understand 'why' questions (Why was the Gingerbread man running?)</p> <p>Discussing what the children have made, using longer sentences.</p>
Expressive Arts and Design	<p>Joining in with songs and rhymes.</p> <p>Colour recognition and colour mixing (I wonder what will happen if we mix red and yellow together?)</p>

	Join in with role play, using role play masks.
Understanding of the World	Playing with small world models. Discussing different celebrations. Making porridge and adding textures. Making gingerbread biscuits.
Physical Development	Running safely within the outdoor environment. Show preference for a dominant hand. Join in with games (Musical statues). Become independent when putting on our coats .
