Enquiry Question	Who am I ? (Me and my community- Exploring Autumn)
Significant People	Jean Loo – Director of Superhero Me 
Class Texts	Goldilocks and the three bears, Stick Man, Peace at last   
Literacy	The children will be learning Phase 1 phonics– Rhyming words and Action songs. Reading favourite stories. Can we talk about what is happening in the pictures? Filling in missing words from a rhyme Learning the names of different parts of a book (Front cover, back cover, pages)

<p>Maths</p>	<p>Joining in with number rhymes and songs</p> <p>Begin to use positional language (Behind, in front)</p> <p>Begin to recall numbers from 1-5, 1-10</p>
<p>Communication and Language</p>	<p>Clapping out rhymes and joining in with actions</p> <p>Talking about different experiences and celebrations</p> <p>Using past and present tenses (I played with my toy)</p> <p>Understand 'why' questions (Why did the bears go for a walk ?)</p> <p>Discussing what the children have made, using longer sentences</p> <p>Recall some parts of a familiar story</p>
<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p>	<p>Drawing pictures from a story</p> <p>Painting bears</p> <p>Making stick hand puppets</p> <p>Tap out a beat to help Mr Bear fall asleep</p> <p>Begin to role play parts of the stories</p>

Physical Development	Kick/catch a large ball Fruit tasting (Different textures) Turning pages correctly in a book Building with small and large blocks Developing pencil grip using a range of tools (Pencils/crayons)
