Communication and Language	<p>We encourage the children to listen to stories and orally retell parts of a story (What is happening at the beginning, middle, end of the story?)</p> <p>The children will learn new vocabulary through a range of fiction and non-fiction books. Throughout the day we will encourage the children to answer how and why questions</p> <p>To know and talk about the different factors which affect their health and wellbeing</p> <p>-Talk about their work (choice of colours, tools and materials used)</p>
Expressive Arts and Design	<p>-Use dough to create models (Colour monsters)</p> <p>-Use tape to join junk modelling materials to make a colour monster</p> <p>-Draw self portraits</p> <p>-Talk about their features using mirrors</p>

Understanding of the World	<p>Talking about own experiences/celebrations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Learning about different occupations (Teacher, librarian, care taker, shop assistant) · Exploring the outdoor environment (What can you see, hear, feel ?) . Collecting natural objects. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Learn how to use the front facing camera function on the iPad -Take photographs of themselves -To understand how to be safe online
Physical Development	<p>Experiment with different ways of moving and negotiating spaces successfully (Rolling, crawling, walking, jumping, running, hopping, skipping, climbing)</p> <p>Form recognisable letters/Develop correct letter formation</p> <p>Developing fine/gross motor skills</p>

	<p>Using cutlery, paint brushes and pencils correctly</p> <p>Introduce children to balls games with teams, rules and targets</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">-Use scissors safely- To know and talk about the different factors which affect their health and wellbeing
